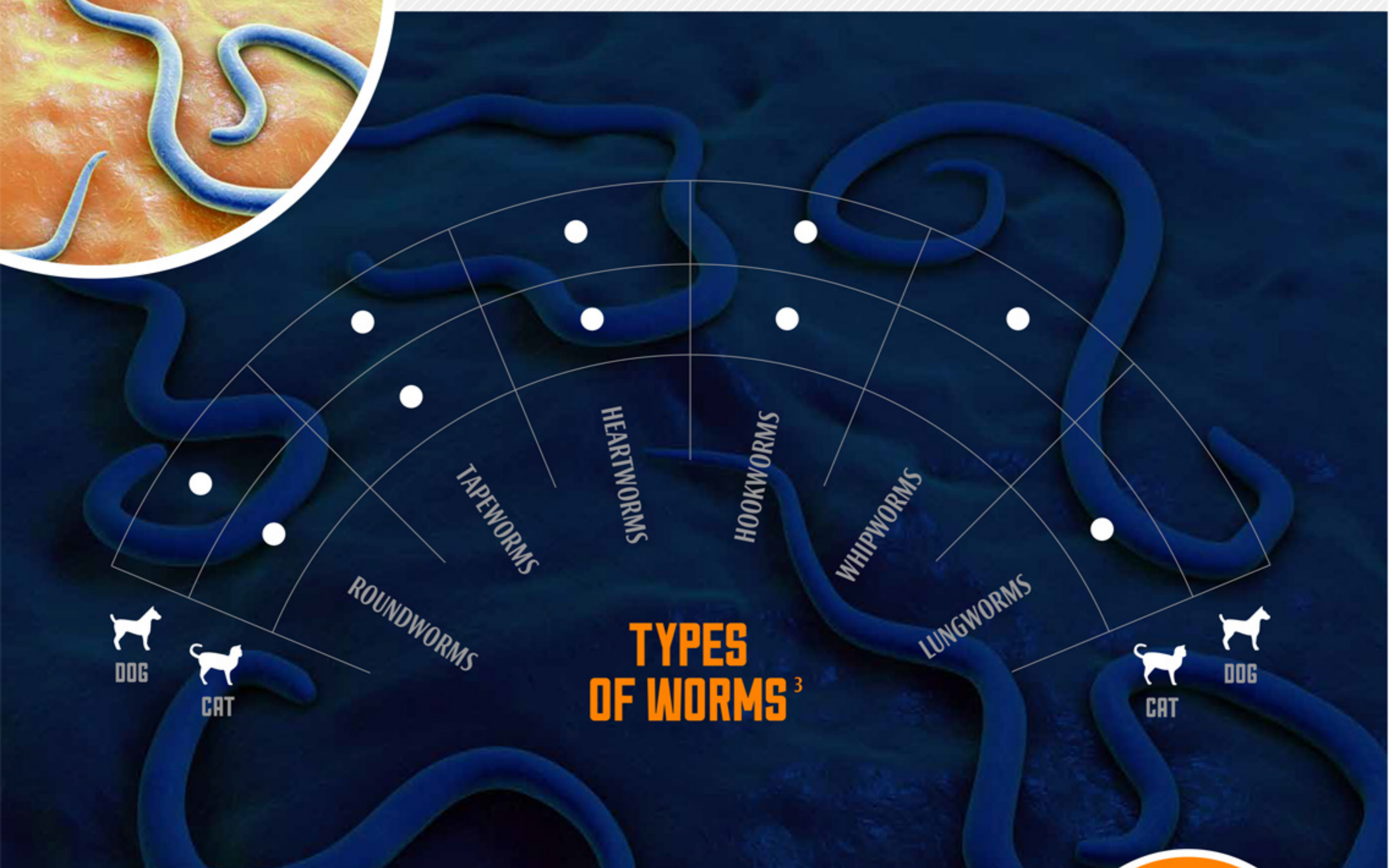


THE WORLD OF WORMS

Cats and dogs alike can acquire worm infections when they come across tiny worm eggs. Worm eggs can be found in animal feces, fleas, infected mother's milk and picked up through scavenging.¹



ROUNDWORMS are the most common type of worm in kittens, puppies, cats and dogs.²



The presence of worm eggs can often only be detected microscopically, so a stool sample is often required to discover which type of worm is present.⁴



COMMON SYMPTOMS DUE TO INTESTINAL PARASITES⁵

Diarrhea
Change in appetite
Lethargy
Weight loss



If worms grow into adults, they may be visible in your dog/cat's feces or in the fur around your dog/cat's rear end.

PREVENTION OF PARASITES⁶

- *Remove feces from yard or litter box at least once a week*
- *Watch where your dog goes in the dog park*
- *Do not mix dewormers*
- *Use correct dewormer under vet supervision and have frequent feces checks*
